Following the recent publication of a joint Domestic Homicide Review and Safeguarding Adults Review into the life of Jayne (not her real name), we would like to share our condolences with her family and friends following her tragic death.

The review has helped to identify what needs to change or improve locally so similar circumstances can be avoided in the future.

We are fully committed to acting on the recommendations made by the review and work is underway to implement those recommendations.

This tragic case is a reminder of why addressing domestic abuse remains a priority for Safer Cornwall, Cornwall's Community Safety Partnership, and Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly Safeguarding Adult Board.

Our thoughts remain with Jayne's family, and we would like to thank them for participating in this process.

Safer Cornwall, Cornwall's Community Safety Partnership has responsibility for undertaking Domestic Abuse Related Death Review (DARDR). These were previously called Domestic Homicide Reviews. The Victims and Prisoners Bill received Royal Assent on 24 May 2024 and the name change has been confirmed at Part 1 Section 19 of the Victims and Prisoners Act 2024.
