



# Safer Falmouth Delivery Plan 2026-2027

The aim of Safer Falmouth is to **improve community safety and reduce crime and anti-social behaviour** by targeting resources to the people and places that need it most within the geographical area, and working with **communities, partners and the business and voluntary sectors** to develop **sustainable solutions**.

Safer Falmouth will facilitate and support a multi-agency approach to community safety issues to improve public reassurance, reduce the risk of harm to the community and protect vulnerable groups. Communities will be actively involved in the work of the partnership which will encourage social inclusion and community resourcefulness through being part of the problem-solving process. Achieving safer communities depends upon everyone working together to find local solutions to local problems.

Based on the evidence presented in the Falmouth Town Profile and feedback from the Residents Survey, the following have been identified as community safety priorities for the town:

1. **Night-time Economy & Violence Against Women and Girls**
2. **Domestic Abuse**
3. **Provision for Young People**
4. **Drug Exploitation -**
5. **Anti-Social Behaviour**
6. **Homelessness**
7. **Communications and Engagement**

These priorities will be addressed through this delivery plan. Progress will be measured through achievement of quarterly and annual milestones over the lifetime of the plan and key deliverables/outcomes will be reported to the Safer Cornwall Partnership.
